



Nursery - You could make a shop using tins from the cupboard and toys from around the house. Your items should only go up to 10p. Using 1p's only can your child buy things from the shop by counting out the correct amount of pennies.

Reception - As above however, your items can cost up to 20p.

Year 1

1. Janine has 18p in her purse. She puts 10p in the collection for Comic Relief. How much does she have left?
2. Annie has 20p. She gives her brother 12p to buy a cake at the school fair. How much money will she have left?
3. Halim's mother gives him £1 to buy his sister a birthday present. He buys a pencil for 46p. How much change will he receive?

Year 2- Continuing with fractions can you collect as many 1p's as possible? Can the children find out half of 10p? A quarter of 12p? 3 quarters of 20p? For example they may use 20 pennies and split them into 4 equal groups to find quarters. To find 3 quarters they must put together 3 of the piles they have made. Are all the groups equal? This can be extended by representing pennies as dots on paper. They could draw 4 circles to represent the quarters and then share 20 dots equally into the 4 circles 1 dot at a time until they get to 20 then add up 3 of the circles.

## TUESDAY

Nursery - Play a game of I spy on your daily walk. Encourage the children to really listen for the initial sounds. If your child is struggling then you can slightly adapt it for example 'I spy with my little eye something beginning with c.... could it be tree? Could it be sky? Could it be car?

Reception - Using a paintbrush and water go outside and practice letter writing, call out a sound can your child remember what it looks like and write it using water on the pavement? Then you could give our child cvc words to write such as pat, mad, dip

Year 1 and 2 - Can your child find out about why Easter eggs are sold in shop in the lead up to Easter? Your child could make an Easter poster or make a comic of the Easter story.

## Wednesday

Nursery and Reception - Read a traditional tale and make some masks of the characters that are in that tale. You can then re-tell the story together using the masks. There are printable masks on Twinkl if you don't have any art or craft things at home.

Year 1 - Read a story that has one of your child favourite character in. Ask your child about the character...Do they change in the story? Why do you think they are kind?

Can your child draw their chosen character and write as many descriptive words about that character e.g. the wolf in the Little Red Riding Hood is...sneaky, sly, scary, clever, greedy

Year 2 - Read a story that has one of your child favourite character in. Ask your child about the character...Do they change in the story? Why do you think they are kind?

Your child could do a character description of their chosen character from their story.

## Thursday

All years - Can you make an Easter basket using recyclable materials. You could bake something together to go inside your treats basket.

## Happy Friday

All - You can use: A cut out egg shape from a cardboard box or a hard-boiled egg to create your favourite character on your egg shape e.g. Spiderman, Elsa from frozen, Buzz light year, minion, princess etc.
