



Nursery - Hide numbers 0 -10 around your house or garden. See if your child can find them all and put them into the correct order.

Reception - Can they add by counting on? Have a look in your fruit bowl, how many of each fruit have you got in there? Look at different ways of combining amounts? For example, what number do you get if you combine bananas and apples? Grapes and lemons? Verbalise the number sentence, such as $5+4=$. Could they count on? E.g. for $5+4$, 5... 6, 7, 8, 9.

Year 1 and 2

*Choose some different sized objects. Is the largest object always the heaviest? Why? Why not?

*Choose 3 tins, packets or boxes and find where the weight is written. Line them up in order by looking at their weight.

*Choose 3 different toys that feel to be different weights. Line them up from lightest to heaviest

For physically active maths lessons you can go to the website homeschool.mightmaths.co.uk There are short videos of around 15 minutes each containing arithmetic sessions. The lessons are in line with the national curriculum.

TUESDAY

Nursery and Reception - Put some shaving foam in a tray, can your child practice letter formation in the foam? They could even try and write some words!

Years 1 and 2 - Can you write a recount of your Eid day.

Think about:

- What did you do
- Where did you go?
- What did you eat?
- Did you get any presents?

Check:

- Capital letters and full-stops.
- Your spelling in a dictionary.
- That you have used some interesting adjectives



Nursery - Write some different letters on the floor using chalks or even on paper if you have no chalk. Can your children run to the letter that you call out? You could write familiar names such as their own and their siblings including mum and dad. Can they run to these as they begin to recognise them? Don't worry if they can't.

Reception - Write a variety of words for your child on the floor, they can be simple CVC words like pen, dog, cot, or you could include some with the sounds 'sh', 'ch', 'th', 'ai'. You could write them using chalk or on pieces of paper with a pen. Say one of the words and encourage your child to throw a beanbag or bounce a ball onto the correct word.

Year 1 and 2 - Could you write a wanted poster for a famous book villain? It could be the wolf from Little Red Riding Hood for example. You should be able to describe them from what they have read about in books. You can find examples online.



All - Can you take a local walk around the area particularly grassy areas looking for flowers. The children need to be able to identify common flowers such as daisies and buttercups. You can print off a flower sheet and your child can tick off any flowers that they spot on their walk.



All- Watch the space launch on youtube from the 30th May. Space X even has its own website. Why is going to space dangerous for the astronauts? What are the astronauts and scientists trying to find out? You could make your own space rocket using recyclable materials and tinfoil. What is inside a space rocket? What food do astronauts eat? How do they go to the toilet?
