

Nursery - Make some number cards. Sing the song 5 Little Speckled Frogs - count down from 5, match them to the correct number. Can you say what number comes next if we are counting down? What comes next if we are counting up?

Reception - Can they take away by counting back? Get some small items of food, e.g. grapes, chocolates, berries, etc., how many have you got? Model saying 'I have got 6 grapes, if I eat 4, how many will I have left? Verbalise the number sentence, such as $6-4=$. Could they count back? E.g. for $6-4$, 6... 5, 4, 3, 2


Year 1 and 2 - Look at our website under home learning find the next maths assessment papers. Again these are concepts that your child has covered before. If your child struggles with a question do not worry as you can make up some questions similar to it to give your child chance to practice.

For physically active maths lessons you can go to the website homeschool.mightmaths.co.uk There are short videos of around 15 minutes each containing arithmetic sessions. The lessons are in line with the national curriculum.

TUESDAY

Nursery- Choose your favourite book. "Read" it to your grown up using the pictures. Then ask your adult to read you the story and follow the words with your finger.

Reception - Play a game of 'Noughts and Crosses', but instead use tricky words! Maybe write the two chosen words at the top of the grid to encourage correct spelling. You could choose the words: I, the, no, go, to, into, he, me, she, we, be, was, you, my, are, of. See who wins between you and your child!



Years 1 and 2 - Part of reading is being able to research things for information. Where does my food come from?

Support your child when researching while using the internet to answer these key questions.

*Where does chocolate come from?

*How does milk arrive in the shops?

*The fruit you eat where does it come from?

Don't worry if they cannot read it themselves are they able to retain the information they listen to as this is an important reading skill too.



Nursery - After listening to the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar can you draw and label some of the fruits that the caterpillar ate on his journey? You can find this story on youtube.

Reception - Encourage your child to write you a message! You can even write a message for your child to reply to and help them to read it, e.g. 'What do you want for lunch?' Encourage your child to draw a picture or write a response to your message. Would they like to write a message to anyone else, e.g. a family member or a neighbour?

All - Around this time of year we begin to learn about life cycles. We normally have caterpillars in school and we watch them transform into chrysalis and then into butterflies. We all get together and set the butterflies free. The children love looking out for them in the playground.

Could you have a go at being a caterpillar egg (you can watch the life cycle on youtube) , then burst out of you egg and become a tiny caterpillar, wriggle around getting bigger and bigger until you transform into a chrysalis then become the beautiful butterfly? Year 1 and 2 children could have a go at recording each stage of the caterpillar life cycle and describing what happens in each stage.



Nursery and reception - Using a paper tub e.g. toilet roll inner to create a mini beast e.g. butterfly, bee, ladybird



Year 1 - Find a photograph/ picture of your favourite flower (Online or in a magazine)

Draw/paint a picture of it, make sure you look carefully.

Make a frame for it using sticks, card, straws and give it to someone special in your family. Don't forget to write a lovely message on the back



Year 2 - Look at the painting called "Sunflowers" by the artist Vincent Van Gogh. (Online) Using paints, felt tips or crayons create your own sunflower picture based on the style of the artist frame your work and give it someone special in your family.
